An important piece of creating welcome and safety on Sunday morning is knowing and easily identifying who is available to respond in emergency situations. To that end, we will be introducing a few new lanyards over the next several weeks:

- **Red** lanyards for those willing to respond in health emergencies
- Yellow lanyards for those willing to respond in mental health crises
- **Purple** "Volunteer" lanyards for those serving as hosts each week
- **Silver** "Safety First" lanyards for those responding to other emergencies.
